

Thank you so much for joining me Wednesday evening for Painting the Meadow!

As we talked about during the demo, even when something feels just about finished, getting distance from your work is really an essential part of the painting process. When I took a fresh look at this painting the next morning, I decided on a few minor adjustments to bring it to completion:

1. In the meadow grasses: I felt the grasses needed unifying, so I added some soft layers, first adding cool midtone green (almost turquoise) all over the meadow

to unify, then a bit more light warm green in the lights, to generally bring together the feeling of soft, wavy grasses moving back in space.

2. The Wildflowers: I had just begun those last night, and added a lot more purple sprinkling everywhere, as it works great as a foil for the greens without jumping too much. Then I went in with a couple of the yellows and added very small scatterings to lead the eye around. Those jump a lot more so I had to be more intentional about where I placed them.

3. I added a bit more detailing and layering in the trees, adding peach in the center of some of the larger violet sky holes on the right, and adding varying greens on the darks to give them more life and texture.

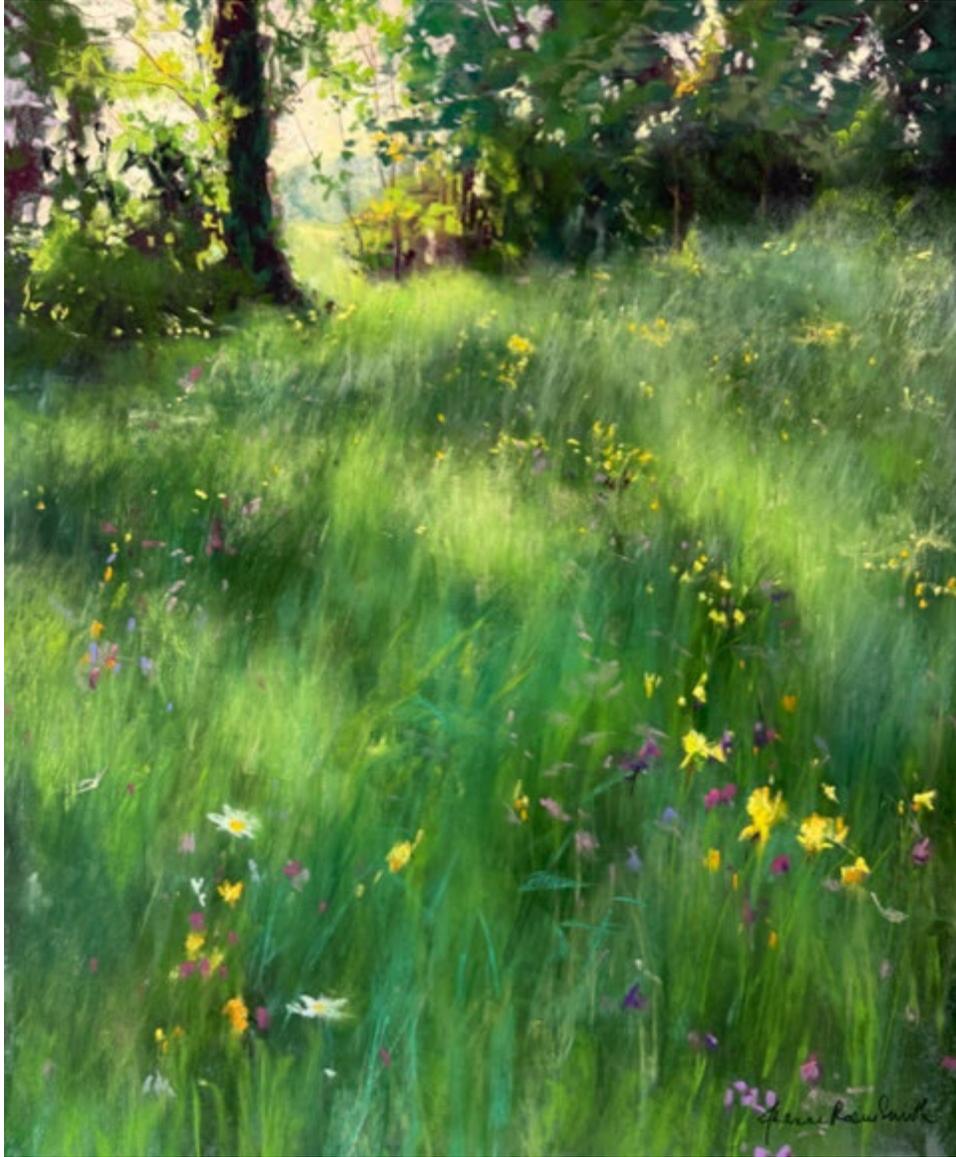

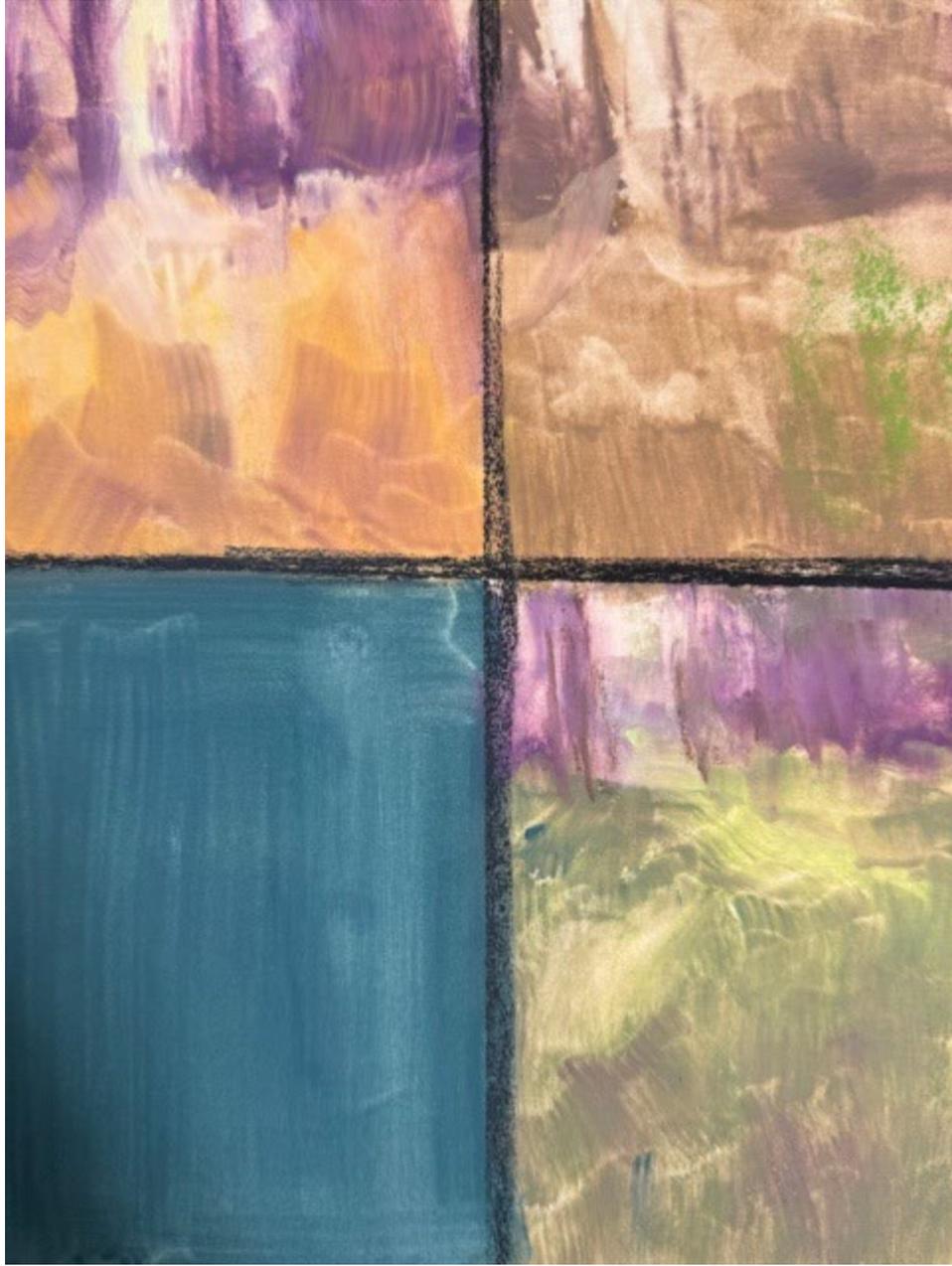

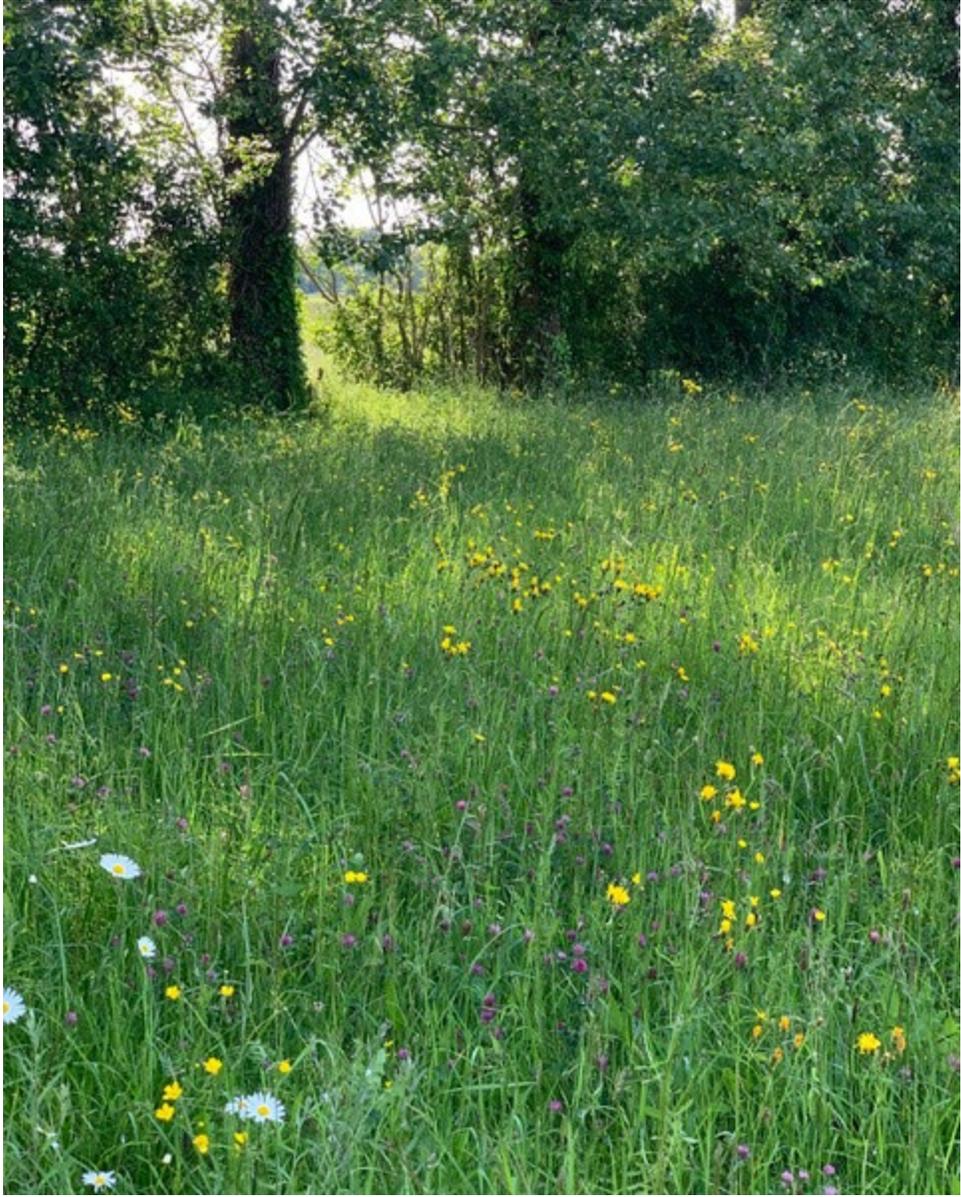
